Club Captain Anton Lindell did a wonderful job of organising the team and everyone had a super weekend.

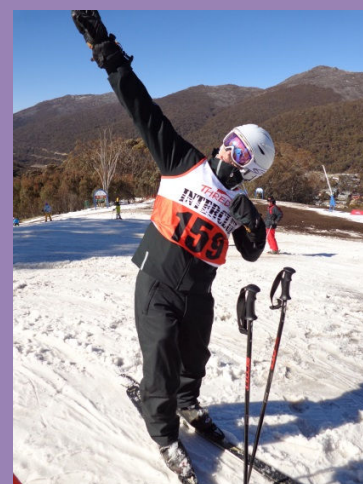

Presidents Update

I can't believe it is almost the end of August so my apologies for the delay in sending a winter newsletter. Unfortunately some heavy work commitments have gotten in the way.

Better late than never so here is an update on what is happening with the club, the lodge and Thredbo.

The snow season this year has been completely different to last year. 2012 was one of the best seasons in last years and up until last week, 2013 was looking like one of the worst seasons. I'm pleased to say we received solid snow falls over the past 10 days and there is more expected to come this week so hopefully we are in for a strong late season. So, if you are up for some skiing and boarding, be sure to contact our Lodge Managers Michelle and John as we do have some availability in late August and throughout September.

In August Kiama competed in the Thredbo Senior InterClub races with solid results. Thirteen members competed in the races on the Rossignol race track out of a total 154 racers, with our team finishing a very credible 6th fastest and Sven Lindell finishing 5th fastest male skier. Well done to the whole team and to our Club Captain Anton Lindell for all his work in organising the team.

The Club Weekend is this weekend. With good snow expected it should be a great hit. We have a trivia night planned and some fun games for the children. The theme this year is Superheroes, Villains & Movie Stars so I expect to see Superman, Batman, Marilyn and others to be gracing the communal dinner on Saturday night. I can't wait.

So what has been happening since the last newsletter?

Our 2013 Annual General Meeting was held in May at the Kiama Pavilion with our two new Life Members, Sandy Rendel and Rob Walker along with around 40 members attending.

Vice-President Trevor Wilson retired from the Board following 9 years' service with Tony Lloyd taking over the role of Vice-President. Karyn Bartholomew, James Garner and I re-nominated for the Board. Thank you to members for accepting my nomination to continue as President. I have thoroughly enjoyed the past 3 years and look forward to continue to contributing in improving our Club. At the AGM, Phill Deer, our Promotions and Thredbo Liaisons Director, provided an update on Thredbo having recently met

with Jordan Rogers, the Managing Director appointed last year for KT Pty Limited who run Thredbo. Jordan was able to provide Phill and I with a detailed and positive face-to-face update which sounded very promising.

KT are focusing on re-building the Thredbo brand with major building works in the pipeline (although yet to be confirmed) to replace the hotel, expand the village square and provide Thredbo-based staff accommodation. Other initiatives include a greater emphasis on advertising and marketing, improved lift pass pricing, the return of winter entertainment with DJs and bands in the village and the introduction of iconic summer events such as the Chris Isaack concert at Easter. Unfortunately there are no new plans to replace the Ramshead Chairlift or create any new ski runs but there is a lot of attention happening for the summer mountain biking. Having been in Thredbo last week the village definitely seems more positive and vibrant and the locals are also sounding more confident. The Thredbo staff are actually more customer focused and much more flexible than they have in the past and there is more music and entertainment in the village. The Thredbo App is very useful and the electronic ticket system makes using the lifts even easier.

The Lodge is looking great thanks to the well-attended May Working Bee and regular maintenance by our Lodge Managers Michelle and John, and Directors Andrew Heggie and Drew Waters.

This year we replaced 5 beds (which I hear are very comfortable), the chimney flue was re-painted and now looks brand new, the window sills have been re-varnished plus all the broken window winders have been replaced. Mitch Coleman kindly adjusted the new low energy lighting in the kitchen making it not quite as bright. Additional heaters have been added to the back rooms as we were finding them a little cold. In the kitchen we have replaced many utensils and added a slow cooker. Just prior to winter we had all the carpets steam cleaned, the chimney flue swept, the Lodge was sprayed externally for bugs to keep the cob webs low, the windows cleaned, plus the boilers were checked and the 6-month fire inspection has been completed. In 2014 we plan to upgrade the upstairs bathrooms and re-fresh the adjoining bedrooms so we have quite a bit of preparation work to complete this year to make this happen.

Chas Keys and Alan Fredericks have been working on the updated chapters for the Kiama in the Mountains from 1997 to today. See the attached update from Chas.

On a sad note, we recently lost long-term member and former Lodge Manager, Sally Walker who passed away in April this year following a brave 12 month battle with bowel cancer. Sally will be missed by so many members and we send our sincere condolences to her husband Robert and sons Adam and Matthew along with the entire extended Walker family. The Lodge just isn't the same without Sally's smiling face but we know she is watching over us.

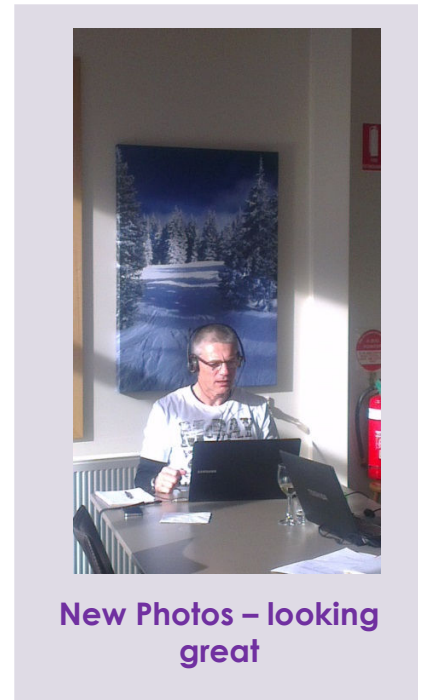
Lodge Operations Update

'Kiama in the Mountains': the story goes on . . .

Long-term members will recall that in 1997 a book about the club was launched, detailing its history since Kiama residents Eugene and Lala Baranowsky first dreamed of an alpine lodge in the Snowy Mountains. Now there is to be a sequel, or extension, to bring the Kiama Alpine Club's story up to date. The extension will be launched at next year's AGM.

The author seeks information from members to help him tell the story of the last 17 years. The extension will cover the development of Thredbo, changes to the club's board, improvements to the lodge and its surrounds, the operations of the club and lodge, club members' skiing both at Thredbo and overseas, members' participation in non-skiing recreations at Thredbo, the celebration of the club's first 50 years and the impact of social change on the club and the lodge.

This appeal is for information that will help to flesh out and complete the story and ensure that the members are involved in the recording of it. In particular the author would like to cover in some detail the skiing endeavours of members, both socially and in racing at Thredbo (including in the Thredbo Interclub) and at overseas ski resorts. He would also like to catalogue the progress of the club's young skiers, for example in InterSchools competition. But he is also interested in other themes and is open to writing about other matters that concern the members. He is open, for example, to dealing with issues that are not mentioned in the previous paragraph. Anything that is interesting, informative or amusing is eligible for inclusion!

I'm waiting for your input. When the text is close to being finished we will also be looking for photos of club members skiing, enjoying the lodge, participating in working bees or otherwise engaged in mountain activities. These will be added to the photos that Barry Booth has already compiled. At the moment there is no deadline for contributions, but don't feel you should wait. If you have something to contribute, strike now! The club's story will be better for its members providing information on which it can be based.

Vale for Sally Walker

The Kiama Alpine Club, Thredbo Historical Society and the Thredbo village lost a valuable contributor to its community with the passing of Sally Walker aged 57 on 8 April in the Mater Hospice in Newcastle, after a 12 month battle with cancer. Originally from Berry on the South Coast, Sally and her husband Rob had been regular skiing visitors to Thredbo for nearly 40 years. This culminated in their taking on the Lodge Manager roles at the Kiama Alpine Club Lodge, in 2008.

Whilst in Thredbo Sally quickly settled into life in the alpine village, managing the lodge and its administration, had short stints of work in the Post Office and volunteered in the role as Treasurer and Subscription officer for the Thredbo Historical Society and Subscription Officer for Kiama Alpine Club which she served with great distinction. Living in Thredbo allowed Sally and Rob to pursue their passion for "out the back" skiing adventures and summer bushwalking.

Sally's professional career was that of a High School Maths teacher which equipped her with all of the skills necessary to fulfil these many and varied roles, with great accuracy and attention to detail.

Sally's funeral service was held at Nowra with many Kiama Alpine Club members in attendance and past-President Alan Fredericks providing the Eulogy. She is survived by husband Rob, and sons Adam and Matthew and will be sadly missed by all.

Vale for Laurie McCarthy

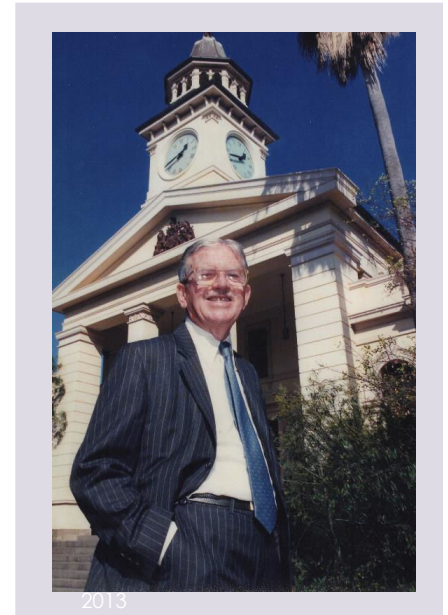
Laurie McCarthy (formerly of Wollongong) died at the age of 96 on June 30 and his funeral was held in Bowral on 9 July.

Heggies Irish Cream

Finally we have extracted the famous "Heggies Irish Cream" recipe from Andrew Heggie!



Ingredients:

- 1 egg
- 1 cup (or so) of cheap whiskey
- 1 can of sweetened condensed milk
- 1 tablespoon of chocolate syrup
- 300ml cream

Blend gently in 1 litre jug and chill in the fridge - if you can wait that long.

I call it "Heggies" others find it reminiscent of Baileys but much cheaper, most find it delicious.
